The following are the specific requirements for admission to the Teacher Certification Program:

1. Completion of 54 semester hours prior to enrollment in Professional Education Courses.
2. Passage of THEA/TASP, TSI complete or exempt.
3. Complete Nelson-Denny Reading Assessment.
4. GPA of 2.5 in 9 semester hours of lower division English; 6 semester hours must be in composition.
- 5 Overall GPA of 2.75 in all lower division courses that apply to teacher certification.

- 6 Provide criminal background check results to Educator Preparation Office.
7. Lower division courses must be completed before admission to Teacher Education.
